The two teams have met on 20 occasions during BBLs 01-13 including semi-finals in BBLs 03 and 08.

The Stars have won 13 and the Hurricanes seven. Each has won one of the semi-finals. Nine of the matches have been played on the MCG with six being won by the Stars while, of the nine played on Bellerive Oval, the Stars have won five.

The two matches played at other venues were won by the Stars.

THE COACHES

Peter Moores played as a wicketkeeper with Worcestershire and Sussex, captaining Sussex in 1997 and retiring in 1998 to focus on his coaching career.

Moores was appointed coach of the Melbourne Stars in March 2023, replacing David Hussey who went off to become Victoria's head of male cricket. Moores coached England on two occasions, in 2007-2009 and 2014-2015. He won three English county championships with Sussex and Lancashire, two T20 Blast titles and a one-day title with Nottinghamshire where he has been coach since 2017. He will remain with Nottinghamshire whilst coaching the Stars.

Melbourne Stars general manager Blair Crouch said of Moores, "Peter was the outstanding candidate from a very strong group of applicants... ..(he) is the best man to lead this group."

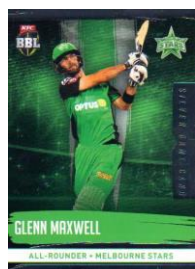


Jeff Vaughan was appointed as the Hobart Hurricanes' head coach in July 2022 by the team's strategy leader Ricky Ponting. James Hopes and Darren Berry were appointed as his assistant coaches.

A right-arm medium pace bowler and right hand top order bat, Vaughan played in 28 first class and 24 List A matches for South Australia between 1996 and 2003. In 2021 he was appointed, with Michael Di Venuto, as an assistant coach of the Australian national side. In 2022 he left to take on the coaching position at the Tasmanian Tigers, the State's Sheffield Shield and Marsh Cup side.

Hurricanes' captain Matthew Wade has described Vaughan as "one of the best coaches I've worked with".

Vaughan says of his squad, "the entire playing group here (Tasmania) has been fantastic to work with and I'm thrilled I'll still get to work with some of the guys in the national set-up."

It was on 19 January 2021 when these two sides met at the MCG. Batting first, Glenn Maxwell smashed 154 runs off 64 balls, hitting 22 fours and four sixes. This broke the Big Bash record of 147 held by Marcus Stoinis. Stoinis and Maxwell put on 132 for the third wicket, helping the Stars to an imposing score of 273 for the loss of only two wickets. The Hurricanes were restricted to a score of 167 for the loss of six wickets from their 20 overs.

Maxwell currently has amassed the most runs for the Stars in their matches against the Hurricanes, totalling 526 runs, with an average of 65.75 runs, which surpasses Joe Clarke, who is next best with an average of 64.00 against the Hurricanes.

In the 2023 Cricket World Cup Maxwell scored the fastest century in ODI history, taking 100 off 40 balls (8 x 4, 8 x 6). He also scored 201* against Afghanistan, off 128 balls (21 x 4, 10 x 6)
