A brief look at the career of George Bailey

George Bailey was born in Launceston in 1982 where he played junior cricket for South Launceston Cricket Club. He is the great-great-grandson of George Herbert Bailey who was part of the 1878 touring squad to England. He was educated at Launceston Church Grammar School where he also played cricket. Bailey was a free-flowing right-hand batter with shots all around the wicket. His destructive stroke play enabled him to change the course of a match in a few overs. Notwithstanding he could play long innings as shown by his record in first-class cricket. He also represented Tasmania in football and tennis.

Bailey's playing potential and future leadership qualities were recognised early. He first represented Tasmania in Under 17 and Under 19 Cricket Championships in 1999 and 2000 and captained his state at the Under 19 Championships in 2001. He was a member of the Australian 2002 Under 19 World Cup winning team in New Zealand. He attended the Australian Cricket Academy in 2002 and the Centre of Excellence in 2004.

His first foray into senior state cricket was in a 50-over match in 2001/02. After a moderate beginning he would go on to play 275 List A matches in Australia and overseas; scoring over 8400 runs at a average of 36.84 including 11 centuries over 18 seasons. Bailey started his first-class career for Tasmania in the 2004/05 season after a number of regular players were injured. His quiet first season led into an excellent performance in 2005-6 when in 10 matches he scored 778 runs at an average of 43 22 with a top score of 155. He went on to have a 15-year first-class career scoring over 10 000 runs at 38.32 with 24 centuries and 52 half-centuries including matches played for Hampshire and Middlesex. He was made captain of Tasmania in the 2009/10 Shield season and led his state to its second Shield title in 2010/11.

The season 2011/12 was important for Bailey as he made his debut for Australia in both the T20I and ODI formats; both within a month of each other. As further recognition of his leadership Bailey was appointed team captain before his first T20I against India at Stadium Australia in February 2012 replacing existing captain Cameron White. The only other Australian who made his international debut as captain was David Gregory in the first Test in 1877. Bailey would go on to play 29 T20Is for his country; making 473 runs at 24.89 with a strike-rate of 136.7. He also took his side to the 2012 World T20 semi-finals in Sri Lanka. Bailey played his first ODI in March 2012 during an Australian tour of the West Indies and it is in that format that he achieved greater notoriety in white-ball cricket. In 90 matches he scored over 3000 runs at 40.58 with a highest score of 156.

In the 2013/14 season Bailey was paid the ultimate in recognition by the selectors and made his Test debut against England in the Ashes series. Whilst Australia dominated with a five/nil result Bailey's return was moderate (five matches, 183 runs at 26.14) and did not lead to his retention. He was not selected again for Tests. Bailey ceased playing representative cricket at the end of the 2019/20 season and became an Australian national selector. He is now Chairman of Selectors following the retirement of Trevor Hohns.
