## The Lead-up

This is the fifth of six group matches at the Super 12 stage of the tournament to be played at the MCG leading up to the finals. The group matches are:

India v Pakistan	Sunday, 23 October, 2022	7.00 pm
England v Ireland	Wednesday, 26 October, 2022	3.00 pm
New Zealand v Afghanistan	Wednesday, 26 October, 2022	7.00 pm
Afghanistan v Ireland	Friday, 28 October, 2022	3.00 pm
England v Australia	Friday, 28 October, 2022	7.00 pm
India v Zimbabwe	Sunday, 6 November, 2022	7.00 pm

The semi-finals will be played in Sydney at the SCG on Wednesday, 9 November 2022 and in Adelaide on Thursday, 10 November 2022 with the final being played at the MCG on Sunday, 13 November, 2022.

Today's teams automatically qualified for the 2022 tournament as a result of playing at the Super 12 stage of the 2021 tournament and their ICC rankings at 15 November, 2021. They are among the eight countries entering the 2022 tournament at the Super 12 stage.

## The two Countries in the ICC Men's T20 World Cup to date

The two countries have participated in the seven tournaments played to date. England has reached the second of the final rounds (Groups E and F in 2007 and 2009 and Super8s, 10s and 12s in succeeding tournaments) on each occasion. Australia has reached the second of the final rounds at all tournaments except that played in 2009 when it was eliminated at the end of the first round. England has made the semi-finals on three occasions, going on to win the tournament once (2010) and being runner-up once (2016). Australia has made the semis on four occasions; winning the tournament once (2021) and being runner-up in 2010. The two countries have played each other on three occasions in World Cup tournaments; England winning twice and Australia once. The second occasion that the two teams met was in the final of the 2010 tournament in the West Indies. Summary scores of the match are set out below:

At Kensington Oval, Bridgetown, Barbados, West Indies, May 16, 2010: **AUSTRALIA 6/147** (20 overs) (DJ Hussey 59, CL White 30; RJ Sidebottom 2/26) **lost to ENGLAND 3/148** (17 overs) (C Kieswetter 63, KP Pietersen 47) **by seven wickets**. *Player of the Match:* Craig Kieswetter

Since the commencement of international T20I cricket England and Australia have played 20 matches against each other (including the three matches played as part of ICC T20I World Cups). Australia has won ten and England nine with one match recording a no result.
