Notes on table above:

- After the 1998 series in Pakistan Australia's away matches were played at neutral venues in Sri Lanka, the United Arab Emirates and in England as a result of security concerns. In 2022 Australia returned to Pakistan and on tour played three ODIs; winning one and drawing two.
- Matches played at other Australian venues include two staged in mid-winter 2002 at the Docklands Stadium, Melbourne.

Notes on table above:

- Also played ODIs: **Asia XI**, 7, 4W, 2L, 1NR, **Africa XI**, 6, 1W, 4L, 1NR, **ICC World XI**, 4, 1W, 3L, **Jersey**, 5, 1W, 4L, **East Africa** 3, 0W, 3L.
- Australia played England in a 40 over one-day match at the MCG on 5 January, 1971. This match, which would become the first ODI was won by Australia by five wickets. The match was played on one day of an abandoned Test match.
- Pakistan's first ODI was played on 11 February, 1973 at Christchurch in New Zealand, the home team winning by 22 runs.
- The first Australia v Pakistan ODI was played at Leeds on 7 June 1975 as part of the inaugural ODI World Cup; Australia winning by 73 runs.
- Both Australia and Pakistan have competed in all ODI World Cups; Australia winning in 1987, 1999, 2003, 2007, 2015 and 2023. Pakistan's only win was in 1992 at the MCG against England.

AUSTRALIA 9/209 (50 overs) (KJ Hughes 67, WM Darling 41; Sikander Bakht 4/34) **were defeated by PAKISTAN 6/210** (49.2 overs) (Javed Miandad, 72, Mudassar Nazar 44; GS Chappell 3/33, TM Alderman 2/20) **by four wickets.** *Player of the Match:* Javed Miandad.

At MCG, January 9, 1982: AUSTRALIA won the toss and put PAKISTAN into bat. PAKISTAN 6/218 (50 overs) (Zaheer Abbas 84, Mudassar Nazar 40, Javed Miandad 37; JR Thomson 2/55) **defeated AUSTRALIA 193** (49 overs) (AR Border 75*, GM Wood 38, GS Chappell* 35; Sikander Bakht 2/33, Ijaz Faqih 2/34) **by 25 runs.** *Player of the Match:* Zaheer Abbas.

At MCG, January 21, 1984: AUSTRALIA won the toss and decided to bat: AUSTRALIA 8/209 (50 overs) (KC Wessels 86, DW Hookes 37; Abdul Qadir 5/53) **defeated PAKISTAN 166** (45 overs) (Javed Miandad 56; RM Hogg 4/33, AR Border 2/24) **by 43 runs.** *Player of the Match:* Kepler Wessels

At MCG, February 24, 1985: AUSTRALIA won the toss and put PAKISTAN into bat. PAKISTAN 6/262 (50 overs) (Mohsin Khan 81, Mudassar Nazar 69, Imran Khan 32, Qasim Umar 31; SP O'Donnell 2/42, GF Lawson 2/45) **defeated AUSTRALIA 200** (42.3 overs) (SP O'Donnell 74*, WB Phillips 44; Wasim Akram 5/21) **by 62 runs.** *Player of the Match:* Wasim Akram.

At MCG, January 10, 1989: PAKISTAN won the toss and put AUSTRALIA into bat. AUSTRALIA 4/258 (43 overs) (GR Marsh 125*, AR Border 60; Tauseef Ahmed 2/43) **defeated PAKISTAN 7/108** (19 overs) (Imran Khan 42) **on run-rate.** *Player of the Match:* Geoff Marsh.

At MCG, January 3, 1990: PAKISTAN won the toss and decided to bat. PAKISTAN 161 (50 overs) (Imran Khan 39, Mansoor Akhtar 32; CG Rackemann 3/21, PL Taylor 2/36) **lost to AUSTRALIA 3/162** (41 overs) (AR Border 69*, DC Boon 39, SR Waugh 31*) **by seven wickets.** *Player of the Match:* Alan Border.

At MCG, February 23, 1990 (First Final, World Series Cup): AUSTRALIA won the toss and put PAKISTAN into bat. PAKISTAN 162 (47.5 overs) (Wasim Akram 86, Saleem Malik 39; GD Campbell 3/39, TM Alderman 2/26, SP O'Donnell 2/29, CG Rackemann 2/32) **lost to AUSTRALIA 3/163** (45.5 overs) (DM Jones 83*, AR Border 44*; Wasim Akram 2/30) **by seven wickets.**

At MCG, January 12, 1993: AUSTRALIA won the toss and decided to bat: AUSTRALIA 6/212 (50 overs) (DM Jones 84, DC Boon 64; Asif Mujtaba 2/38, Waqar Unis 2/39) **defeated PAKISTAN 7/180** (50 overs) (Rameez Raja 40, Javed Miandad 40, Inzamam-ul-Haq 39*, Saleem Malik 37; CJ McDermott 2/26, PR Reiffel 2/37) **by 32 runs.** *Player of the Match:* Dean Jones.

At MCG, January 16, 1997: PAKISTAN won the toss and decided to bat: PAKISTAN 9/181 (50 overs) (Inzamam-ul-Haq 64, Wasim Akram* 33; Saqlain Mushtaq 30*; AM Stuart 5/26, MG Bevan 3/36) **lost to AUSTRALIA 7/182** (49.3 overs) (MG Bevan 79*; Wasim Akram 4/25) **by seven wickets.** *Player of the Match:* Anthony Stuart.

At MCG, January 16, 2000: AUSTRALIA won the toss and put PAKISTAN into bat: PAKISTAN 9/176 (41 overs) (Abdur Razaq 51*, Saeed Anwar 49; S Lee 3/24, A Symonds 2/27, GD McGrath 2/48) **lost to AUSTRALIA 4/177** (38.5 overs) (SR Waugh 81*, DR Martyn 39*; Shoaib Akhtar 2/32) **by six wickets.** *Player of the Match:* Steve Waugh.

At MCG, January 23, 2000: AUSTRALIA won the toss and decided to bat: AUSTRALIA 9/260 (50 overs) (MG Bevan 83, RT Ponting 53, A Symonds 35; Saqlain Mushtaq 2/45, Shahid Afridi 2/45, Shoaib Akhtar 2/49) **defeated PAKISTAN 245** (48.5 overs) (Ijaz Ahmed 85, Shahid Afridi 45, Moin Khan 33; S Lee 4/37, B Lee 2/48) **by 15 runs.** *Player of the Match:* Michael Bevan.

At MCG, February 2, 2000 (First Final): PAKISTAN won the toss and decided to bat: PAKISTAN 154 (47.2 overs) (Moin Khan 47; GD McGrath 3/17, B Lee 3/18) **lost to AUSTRALIA 4/155** (42.4 overs) (MG Bevan 54, RT Ponting 50; Shoaib Akhtar 2/26) **by six wickets.** *Player of the Match:* Glenn McGrath.

At MCG, February 4, 2005: (First Final): AUSTRALIA won the toss and decided to bat: AUSTRALIA 237 (49 overs) (A Symonds 91, DR Martyn 53; Abdul Razaq 3/33, Shahid Afridi 2/50, Naved-ul-Hasan 2/50) **defeated PAKISTAN 9/219** (50 overs) (Shoaib Malik 66, Inzamam-ul-Haq 51; B Lee 3/23, GD McGrath 3/34, JN Gillespie 2/47) **by 18 runs.** *Player of the Match:* A Symonds.

At MCG, January, 15, 2017: AUSTRALIA won the toss and decided to bat: AUSTRALIA 220 (48.2 overs) (SPD Smith 60, MS Wade 35; Mohammed Aamer 3/47, Imad Wasim 2/37, Junaid Khan 2/40) **lost to PAKISTAN 4/221** (47.4 overs) (Mohammad Hafeez 72, Shoaib Malik 42*, Babar Azam 34; JP Faulkner 2/35, MA Starc 2/45) **by six wickets.** *Player of the Match:* Mohammad Hafeez.

Pakistan won three of the initial four matches played between the two countries at the MCG. Australia won the next nine and the most recent was won by Pakistan.
