AUSTRALIA AND INDIA IN TWENTY20 INTERNATIONALS



Tonight's game is the seventeenth Twenty20 International (T20I) between Australia and India and the fourth to be played at the MCG. To date ten matches have been won by India and six by Australia. In addition one match, programmed for 13 October, 2017 in Hyderabad, India was abandoned.

SYDNEY 2016: SO NEAR AND YET SO FAR

Australia won the toss and batted. After a brief flourish from T20I debutant Usman Khawaja, Shane Watson, the stand-in captain, gave an exhibition of brilliant stroke play to all parts of the ground. His 124 not out from 71 balls included ten fours and six sixes. It was his first century in T20Is in what was to be his final international in Australia and won him the man of the match award in a losing side. Apart from Travis Head (26 from 19 balls), with whom Watson added 93 from 47 balls for the fourth wicket, the remaining batsmen contributed little. Australia had lost the first two matches of the series by comfortable margins batting second, but their 197/5 from 20 overs looked to be a more challenging total for their opponents to chase.

The Indian batting, whilst not including a commanding century, was more consistent. Two aggressive half centuries from Rohit Sharma (52, 38) and captain Virat Kolhi (50, 36) provided early stability and resulted in partnerships of 46 and 78 for the first two wickets. At 2/124 after 12.3 overs the Indians were well placed, but soon after leg-spinner Cameron Boyce dismissed Kolhi, bringing Suresh Raina to the crease. In a threatening spell Boyce had taken wickets in consecutive overs, but two balls later debutant wicket-keeper Cameron Bancroft missed stumping Raina off his bowling. This miss proved costly as Raina went on to compile 49 off 25 balls and steer his team to victory. The result, however, was in doubt until the last ball was bowled: two

runs being needed and four being scored to give the visitors a seven wicket victory. Kolhi whose scores in the three matches were 90 not out from 55 balls, 59 not out from 33 and 50 from 36 was named man of the series.

LASITH MALINGA: A CELEBRATED LIMITED OVERS WARRIOR

Separa Lasith Malinga was born in the old Dutch trading port of Galle in Southern Sri Lanka on 28 August 1983. A right-arm fast bowler, he played beach cricket near his home from his earliest years. He developed his round-arm slinging action, which was similar to that of Australia's Jeff Thomson, but delivered the ball from a lower elevation in front of the umpire, directing it with great accuracy at the batsman's toes. He could also generate considerable bounce to further disturb those who faced him. Sri Lanka is passionate about its cricket and cricketers. Malinga's talent was recognised by the cricketing authorities and he became part of a coaching programme recognising his unconventional technique. He went on to further develop his inswinging yorker and a deceptive slower ball to complement his express pace, bounce and accuracy.

Malinga made his first-class debut in 2001-02 for Galle Cricket Club in the Premier Trophy. After the 2003/04 season, he transferred to the Nondescripts Cricket Club, with whom he remained for the rest of his career. He entered the international cricket world in July 2004, playing in his first Test match in Darwin. He took six wickets in an otherwise lost cause and went on to play 30 Tests for his country over the following six years, taking 101 wickets at 33.15. His Test career was, however, cut short by persistent injury.

Later in the same month, Malinga began his One Day International (ODI) career, at home against the United Arab Emirates and it was in the shorter formats of the game that he would go on to build a reputation as one of the world's finest bowlers. In 13 seasons he would play 204 ODIs, taking 301 wickets at 28.92, with a best return of 6/38 including a hat-trick against Kenya at Colombo in the 2011 World Cup. Earlier, in the 2007 World Cup, he took the only ODI double hat-trick (four wickets in four balls) against South Africa in Guyana. Malinga also took a hat-trick against Australia at Colombo in 2007.

In the Twenty20 (T20) version of the game Malinga's career blossomed at both domestic and international level. During the period between 2006 and 2017, he played 68 T20 Internationals, taking 90 wickets at 19.77 with a best performance of 5/31 against England in Pallekele in 2012 13. He also took a hat-trick against Bangladesh at Colombo in 2017. Malinga has been an outstanding performer in T20 tournaments around the world. In the Indian Premier league he played 110 matches between 2009 and 2017, taking 154 wickets at 19.00 while in the Australian Big Bash League he played two seasons, (2012/13 – 2013/14), taking 18 wickets at 15.00 including a return of 6/7, his best performance in T20 cricket.
