Records in Australia versus India Tests at the MCG

Twenty-two centuries have been scored, 14 for Australia and eight for India. Allan Border, Matthew Hayden, Sir Donald Bradman and Vinoo Mankad have each made two hundreds. The highest is Ricky Ponting's 257 in 2003/04 while the highest for India is Virender Sehwag's 195 in the same match. Bradman (132 and 127*) in the Third Test in 1947/48 is the only batsman to make two centuries in the same match (it was also the only time that "the Don" achieved the feat in a Test).

Twelve five-wicket hauls have been recorded, five for Australia and seven for India. Graham McKenzie's 7/66 in 1967/68 is the best individual performance, while Bhagwat Chandrasekhar took 6/52 twice in the same Test in 1977/78. Two bowlers have taken 12 wickets in a match, Chandrasekhar 12/104 in 1977/78 as mentioned previously, and Bruce Reid 12/126 (6/66 and 6/60) in 1991/92. The only other bowler to capture 10 or more wickets is Graham McKenzie, who took 10/151 (7/66 and 3/85) in 1967/68.

The highest partnership for any wicket was recorded by Virat Kohli and Ajinkya Rahane when they added 262 for the fourth wicket in India's first innings in 2014/15, while the highest for Australia was the second-wicket stand of 234 by Matthew Hayden and Ricky Ponting in Australia's first innings in 2003/04.

The highest innings total is Australia's 8/575 (Harvey 153, Brown 99) in 1947/48, while India's best effort is its 465 (Virat Kohli 169, Ajinkya Rahane 147) in 2014/15. The lowest is India's 67 (Len Johnson 3/8, Doug Ring 3/17) in the second innings of the Fifth Test in 1947/48, while Australia's lowest is its second-innings score of 83 (Kapil Dev 5/28) in 1980/81.

The best wicket-keeping is MS Dhoni's nine dismissals (eight caught and one stumped) in the 2014/15 match. Adam Gilchrist's eight dismissals (all caught) in the 2007/08 match is best for Australia.

Some records for Australia - India Tests at all venues

The highest individual score for India is 281 by V.V.S. Laxman at Kolkata in 2000/01. At the time this was also the highest innings for India in all Tests, but since then Virender Sehwag has compiled two triple-centuries as well as a score of 293 and KK Nair has also scored a triple century. The highest for Australia is Michael Clarke's 329* at the SCG in 2011/12 followed by Ricky Ponting's 257 at the MCG in 2003/04.

The best bowling performance for India is off-spinner Jasu Patel's 9/69 when he spun India to its first victory over Australia at Kanpur in 1959/60. Interestingly, Patel played in just seven Tests overall. For Australia the best figures were recorded by Nathan Lyon, who took 8/50 at Bengaluru in 2016/17.

The best match analysis for India is Harbhajan Singh's 15/217 (7/133 and 8/84) at Chennai in 2000/01. Patel took 14/124 (9/69 and 5/55) at Kanpur in 1959/60, and Harbhajan and Kapil Dev have both taken 13 wickets in a match. For Australia the best analysis is Steve O'Keefe's 12/70 (6/35 in both innings) in a resounding win at Gahunje in 2016/17. Bruce Reid (12/126 at the MCG in 1991/92), Geoff Dymock (12/166 at Kanpur in 1979/80) and Jason Krejza (12/358 at Nagpur in 2008/09) have also taken 12 wickets in a Test for Australia.

The highest partnership has been made for Australia: 386 for the fourth wicket between Ricky Ponting and Michael Clarke at Adelaide in 2011/12. The next three highest have been made for India: 376 for the fifth wicket between VVS Laxman and Rahul Dravid at Kolkata in 2000/01; 370 for the second wicket between Murali Vijay and Cheteshwar Pujara at Hyderabad in 2012/13 and 353 for the fourth by Sachin Tendulkar and VVS Laxman at Sydney in 2003/04. For Australia Michael Clarke and Michael Hussey scored 334 undefeated for the fifth wicket at Sydney 2011/12 while there are two remaining partnerships over 300: Murali Vijay and Sachin Tendulkar scored 308 at Bangalore in 2010/11 for the third wicket while Rahul Dravid and VVS Laxman scored 303 at Adelaide in 2003/04 for the fifth wicket.

Sachin Tendulkar (11) is easily the leading century-maker in contests between the countries, followed by Sunil Gavaskar and Ricky Ponting with eight and Virat Kohli and Michael Clarke with seven. Three players, two from Australia and one from India have each made six: David Boon, Matthew Hayden and VVS Laxman.

The highest innings total is India's 7/705 declared (Tendulkar 241*, Laxman 178) at the SCG in 2003/04. This is one of

only two innings of 700 or more in Tests in Australia, the hosts having made 6/735 declared against Zimbabwe at Perth earlier in the same season. Only one higher total has ever been recorded against Australia – England's 7/903 declared at The Oval in 1938. Australia's highest is its 674 (Don Bradman 201, Lindsay Hassett 198* and Sid Barnes 112) at Adelaide in 1947/48.

The lowest completed total is India's 58 (Ernie Toshack 5/2) on a rain-affected pitch at Brisbane in the inaugural Test between the countries in 1947/48. Australia's lowest is its 83 (Kapil Dev 5/28) at the MCG in 1980/81, which is also its lowest score in any Test at the MCG.
