# LIBRARY FACT SHEET MAY 7, 2023

### MEMORABLE MATCHES BETWEEN THE CLUBS

- In Round 15, 1902 at Victoria Park, Collingwood 12.12 (84) defeated South Melbourne 5.14 (44). Charlie H. Pannam (Collingwood), the first League player to reach the 100 match milestone played his 101st game.
- The 1918 Grand Final (pictured below) at the MCG was played before a crowd of 39,262. A close game saw South Melbourne 9.8 (62) defeat Collingwood 7.15 (57). A miskick by Dick Lee (Collingwood) was marked by Vic Belcher (South Melbourne) who passed to Mark Tandy and then Chris Laird booted a goal.



- In the 1936 Grand Final Collingwood 11.23 (89) defeated South Melbourne 10.18 (78). The crowd of 74,091 saw Ron Todd (Collingwood) kick 4 goals and 10 behinds for the Magpies.
- At Victoria Park in Round 2, 1948 Collingwood 18.17 (125) defeated South Melbourne 10.12 (72). A record crowd of 47,224 attended Victoria Park.
- In Round 14, 2011, at Stadium Australia (Sydney), Collingwood 13.21 (99) defeated Sydney 14.9 (93) before an attendance of 38,053. A brother from each of the Reid (Ben Collingwood and Sam –Sydney) and Shaw (Heath Collingwood and Rhyce –Sydney) families were members of opposing teams. The Reids, both wearing guernsey No. 20, were direct opponents.

# This Round in History – Round 8 on the MCG

The highest score in Round 8 at the MCG is 25.17 (167) by Richmond against Footscray 17.15 (117) in 1981. The overall Round 8 record is 33.21 (219) by the Brisbane Bears in beating Sydney 8.9 (57) at the 'Gabba in 1993. The highest score in a quarter for Round 8 on the MCG is 10.5 (65) by Fitzroy against Richmond in the third quarter in 1992. The overall record is 12.5 (77) by North Melbourne in the third quarter against Footscray at Arden Street in 1983. The most goals by an individual in Round 8 at the MCG is 10. This feat is shared by Melbourne's Fred Fanning against St Kilda in 1947, Jeff Hogg for Richmond against Collingwood in 1991 and Matthew Richardson against the Bulldogs in 2004. The overall Round 8 record is 14 by Gary Ablett for Geelong against Sydney at the SCG in 1994. The highest Round 8 attendances have been at the MCG. Top was 85,659 in 1980 when Richmond defeated Carlton 19.24 (138) to 12.13 (85). In 1992, 83,262 fans saw Carlton 16.9 (105) defeat Collingwood 9.18 (72) and 81,550 saw Melbourne 11.16 (82) beat Geelong 4.11 (35) in 1963.

The following players have booted 10 goals or more in a Collingwood v South Melbourne/Sydney match:

- Peter McKenna (Collingwood) Victoria Park against South Melbourne in Round 19, 1969.
- Brian Taylor (Collingwood) kicked 12.2 against Sydney at the Sydney Cricket Ground in Round 16. 1985.
- Gordon "Nuts' Coventry (Collingwood) kicked 11.9 against South Melbourne at Victoria Park in Round 3, 1929.
- Peter McKenna (Collingwood) kicked 11.2 at Victoria Park in Round 20, 1968.
- Peter McKenna (Collingwood) kicked 11.3 against South Melbourne at Victoria Park in Round 21, 1972.
- Ron Todd (Collingwood) kicked 10.1 against South Melbourne at the Lake Oval in Round 2 1931.
- Bob Pratt (South Melbourne) kicked 10.6 against Collingwood at the Lake Oval in Round 12, 1935.
- Tony Lockett (Sydney) kicked 10.1 against Collingwood at the MCG in Round 7, 1998. This is the best tally between the clubs at the MCG.
